Ms. Morgan highlighted accomplishments such as:

- Completion of the downtown shopping/dining/places of interest map, as well as printing, distribution and completion of the google map.
- Completion and distribution to qualified companies for a rebranding of Lewiston and downtown, in partnership with the City of Lewiston.

- An estimate has been received and a plan is in place to clean and resurface the Dancing Kids bronze statue in Brackenbury Square, as well as the 4 Coyotes and Sacajawea Monument in Pioneer Square.
- Planning is in the works with Parks and Recreation for replacement of existing planters, repairs to trash receptacles, and design of additional seating in partnership with Stuart Johnson's High School.
- A successful return of Crazy Days.

Re: 4th Quarter Updates

This update is being provided to the BID Advisory Board based on the activities and billings since the last meeting on August 19th, 2021. Please be advised that this report will require action on the part of the Board as it contains a workplan revision and budget update.

Highlights of what was accomplished include:

- *Completion of the downtown shopping/dining/places of interest map (enclosed) as well as printing and distribution and completion of the google map. **Map is being updated with new businesses and will be included in a new format in partnership with the Lewiston Tribune and Inland 360. Publication is slated for Plaid Friday on November 26th 2021.***
- *Completion and distribution to qualified companies for a rebranding of Lewiston and downtown, in partnership with the City of Lewiston. **Rebranding has been put on hold due to the election as well as the restructuring of BDL organization and bylaws.***
- *Estimate received and plan is in place to clean and resurface the Dancing Kids bronze statue in Brackenbury Square as well as the Coyotes and Sacajawea Monument in Pioneer Square. The addition of the Pioneer Park statues to the workplan will need to be approved by the BID Advisory Board before this can move forward. The timeframe is early October and bid includes pickup and delivery. City Parks and Recreation will assist with the uninstall and reinstall of the statues. **We have added the additional bronze statue behind the dancing kids as part of this project. Statues are slated to be moved in the next week.***
- *Planning is in the works with Parks and Recreation for replacement of existing planters, repairs to trash receptacles, and design of additional seating in partnership with Stuart Johnson's High School. **Design committee will meet Nov 11th to discuss plans for receptacles, benches and additional needs.***
- *A successful return of Crazy Days. Liberty Theater had over 400 people walk through for tours and it is estimated that over \$2,000 people attended the event. 200 grab and go art projects were handed out to children, thanks to a grant from Idaho Arts. Vendors, downtown retailers and restaurants had record days. **We had Downtown Artwalk in it's most successful year since it's inception. A second Ladies Day out was held with record sales numbers in downtown businesses. Pumpkin Palooza was very well attended and BDL received positive feedback from***

patrons and businesses downtown. We are gearing up for Plaid Friday n November 26th and Small Business Saturday on November 27th to round out this years promotions.

Brenda Morgan has accepted the position of Executive Director effective August 16th. Since then she has hired a part time Events & Promotions Coordinator that has far exceeded her expectations. She also has hired a part time bookkeeper to reorganize the books and make sure we are on track for 2022.

BID assessments are coming in steadily although still roughly around the 10% collection rate where the goal was to be at 5%.

The BDL Board of Directors is working on a budget for 2022 with the new additions in our quickbooks and taking into account the restructuring of events and who can participate. A more thorough update will be included in the next meeting along with financials and targeted goals and tentative deadlines.
