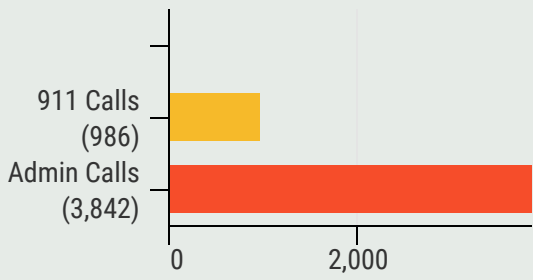
Ofcs. Marketti, McCullough, Vanover, and Brymer completed Introduction to Interview and Interrogation training online

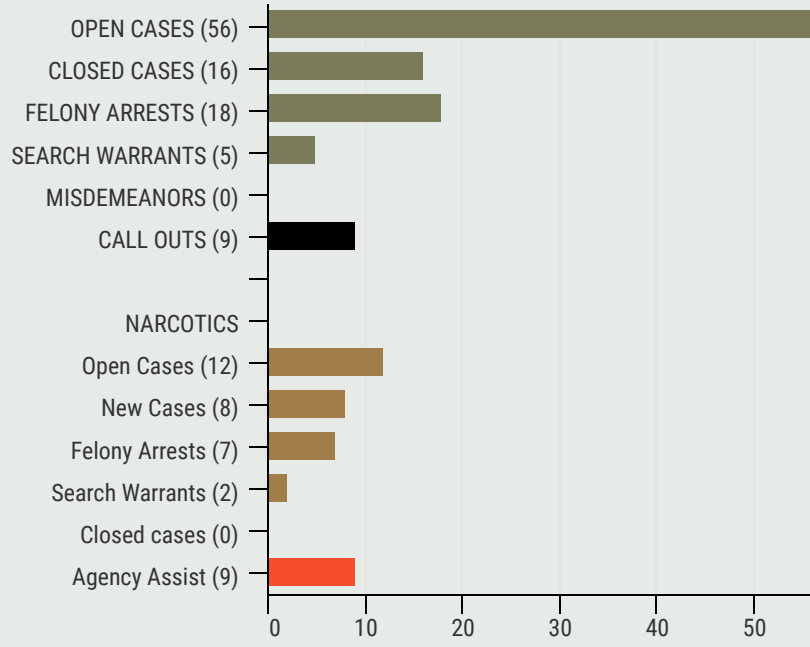


### INVESTIGATIONS

Investigations made multiple felony arrests during the month. Det. Erickson arrested a female in regards to an elder abuse case, detectives worked a robbery where three subjects were arrested, and also an aggravated battery where a subject was arrested for stabbing a male during a fight.

#### Narcotics:

Narcotics detectives seized approximately 1,600 fentanyl pills, 1 ounce of meth, a stolen firearm, and \$3,100 during the month.



### FIELD OPERATIONS

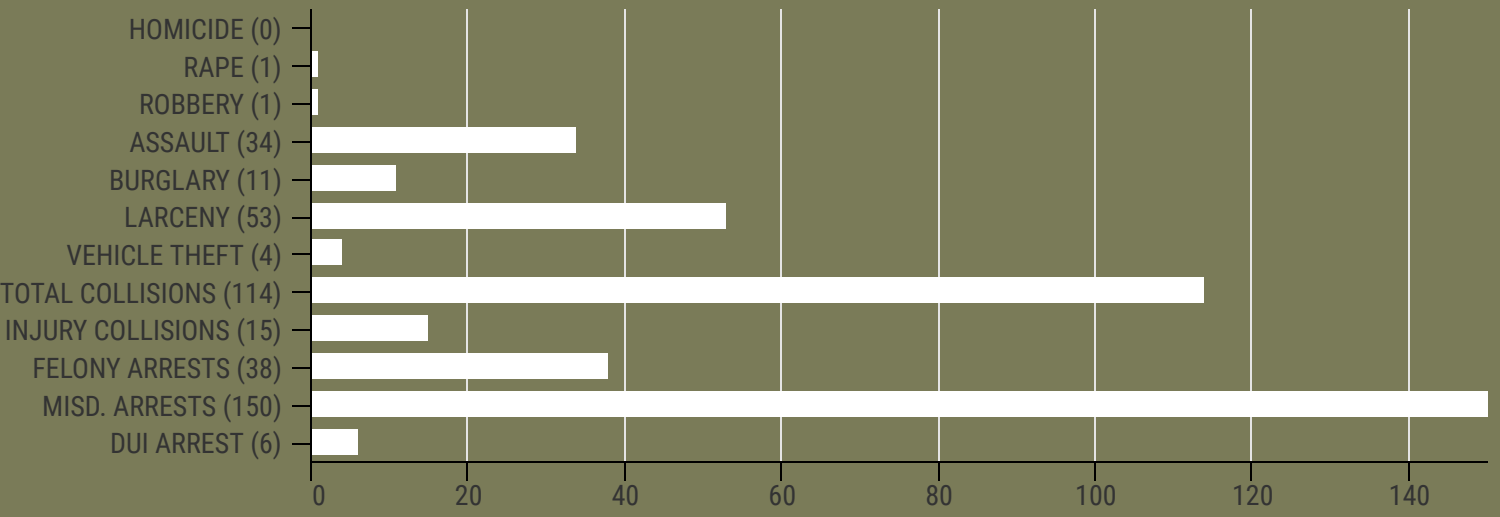
Patrol responded to 1,642 calls for service during the month of November, with 522 of those incidents being cleared with written reports.

During the month of November, Patrol officers responded to:

- a suspicious fire call;
- an elder abuse case that was turned over to Investigations;
- an attempted child abduction case; and
- approximately 35 calls related to the first large snow storm on 11/28

Patrol officers provided police escorts for the Washington Huskies and Deputy Adelbach's memorial service, as well as additional patrol of Winter Spirit

Patrol officers completed various briefing trainings in missing persons, foot pursuits, biased-based policing, communicable diseases, and various policy reviews



### SUPPORT SERVICES

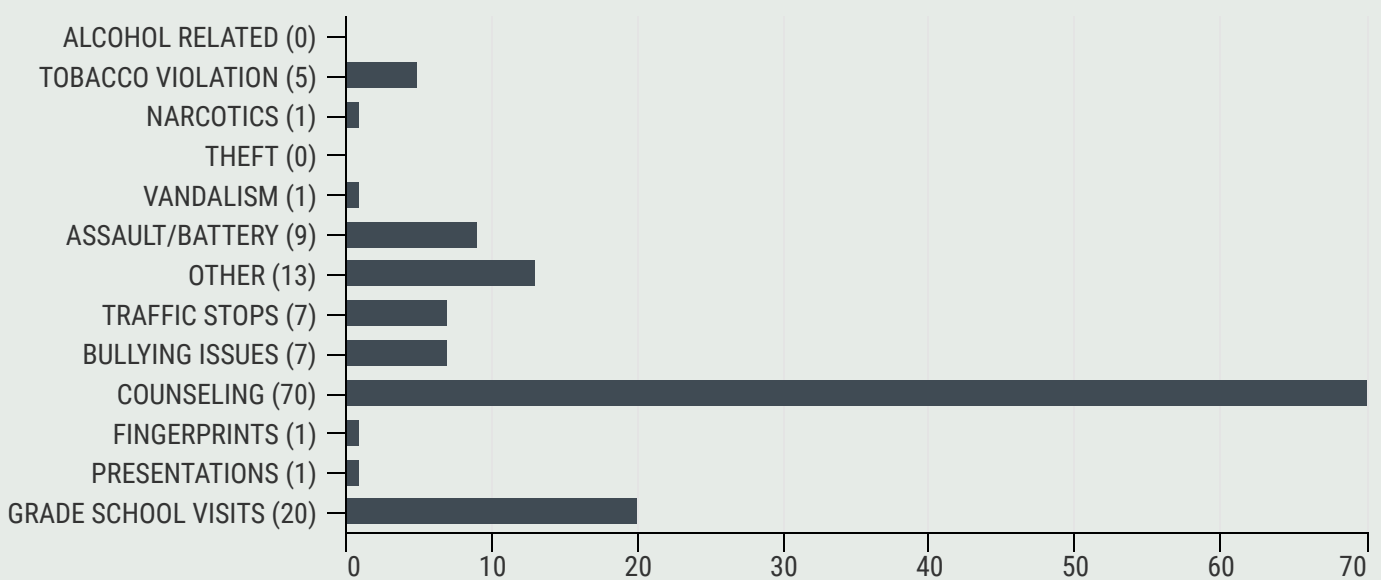
**Administration:** Sgt. Hill held one interview for a dispatch candidate and continued a background investigation on another dispatch candidate; he also attended a Google meeting with the Code Enforcement Officers and other City employees

**Evidence:** 24 items cleared for destruction; 8 items released to owners; 10.45 pounds of drugs collected from drug take-back

**Technology:** PSC Birdsell worked with the 911 coordinator to review power issues in the LPD server room; worked with City IT on the page layout and content for LPD's Intranet page; worked with the City PIO on interviews for LPD's recruitment video; attended training and meetings on the new City Public Records Request system; worked on various LPD social media projects and posts throughout the month; and shared 447 AXON videos for Discovery
